The Problem of Partisan Redistricting

What happens when legislators are allowed to draw the lines of their districts? Most often, district lines make twists and turns that let incumbent politicians or parties dictate the results of a vote, rather than the people they are meant to represent. Monday the 18th at 6:30 pm, speakers from Fair Districts, a non-profit, non-partisan organization, will present information on the redistricting process in PA, causes and effects of gerrymandering, and solutions to getting the power of representation back in the hands of the people. No registration is required.

Runkle Returns with Chief Pontiac's Rebellion

Wed, Sept 27th, historian Steve Runkle continues his series on conflicts between dispossessed Native Americans and the region's exploding population of European settlers in the Susquehanna River Basin, focusing on the rebellion led by Ottawa Chief Pontiac against the English colonies, 1763-64. He'll highlight specific events like Native American assaults on British fortifications, the First Wyoming Massacre, the massacre of the Conestogas, and the Treaty of Fort Stanwix. No registration is required.

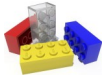
