## General Information

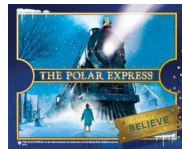
- **Members of the public are welcome to attend Library Board Meetings on the second Tuesday of the month at 7pm.**

## Opioid Addiction & Treatment Education

Along with all York County Libraries, we will be hosting public information sessions that address issues of opioid addiction, substance abuse, treatment, and family recovery. Experts from a variety of area resources, including the York/Adams Drug & Alcohol Commission, RASE Project, and Wellspan Health, will be speaking on a variety of issues. All programs are free to attend, no registration required.

### Opioid 101: Wednesday, Dec 12th from 6-7:30 pm

This program will help people gain a better understanding of addiction, its effects and the recovery process. It will examine factors for people who could be at-risk for developing a substance use disorder and give the audience information on available treatment options.

### Narcan 101: Wednesday, Dec 19th from 6-7:30 pm

Do you know the signs and symptoms of an opioid overdose? Did you know that there is an easily administered treatment? Known as Narcan, this nasal spray counteracts an overdose and saves lives. Learn more about Narcan, substance abuse treatment and recovery in this session.

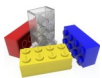
**Tuesdays 10:30 am—Preschool Story Time**
