We will add some baby/toddler favorites if there are younger kids in attendance. We are limiting program attendance to 25 people at this time. Please sign up to guarantee your spot. Walk-ins are welcome until the class is full. Story times in all York County Libraries teach the foundations of reading through singing, playing, talking, writing, and reading. Our staff incorporate PA Early Learning Standards. In addition, children learn social skills, creative expression, civility, and thought process development. Siblings are welcome too! Project Time for Kids — Wednesdays, 1:00 PM-2:00 PM. (Sep 9 is the first day.) Get creative with a different art or science project every week this fall. This program is geared towards children ages 6 to 10, but all are welcome. Homeschooling or cyberschooling this year? Seeking to get out of the house? Have some creative energy to expend? Come join us Wednesday afternoons for make-it, take-it art and science projects. Each week, we'll put together a new project kit for kids aged 6 to 10. Join us outdoors to put your creation together, or take the kit home with you to assemble. Each family will have their own table to work on. You are invited to bring a lawn chair if you like. We are limiting program attendance to 5 families at a time. Please sign up to guarantee your spot. Walk-ins are welcome until the class is full. In case of inclement weather, check our Facebook Page . Even in bad weather, project kits will be available for pickup at the library.

Mystery Bin LEGO Club — Sep 3 6:00 PM-7:00 PM. Take a chance on your very own bin of mystery LEGOS and build a masterpiece. Ages 6 and up.
