4. What well known Bible story is reenacted in *Steinbeck's* **East of Eden?**
5. How many people do you meet in heaven according to *Mitch Albom*?
6. Which *Stephen King* novel features a car as a main character?
7. What book was on the New York Times Best Seller list the longest in 2020?
8. Who reads the audiobook version of *Barbara Kingsolver's* **Prodigal Summer?**
9. Which book won the Pulitzer Prize for Fiction in 2020?
10. Which famous *Dickens* character is most like Dickens himself?
11. From what Pittsburgh, PA University did *Rachel Carson*, author of **Silent Spring**, graduate?
12. What is the title of the 2021 One Book One Community (OBOC) Selection?*
13. **The Handmaid's Tale** and **Testament** by *Atwood* are examples of what kind of fiction?
14. Who is the most recent American to win the Nobel prize for literature?
15. What is the name of *Agatha Christie's* most famous female detective?

Completing the literary scavenger hunt (2/3 of your answers must be correct) **between February 1 and March 15, 2021** will qualify you for one entry into the 2021 Midwinter Reading Challenge prize drawing. Reading the 2021 OBOC selection* earns you another entry, as does reading one book *or* author mentioned in the scavenger hunt (total possible entries per reader =3).
