- 8. A genre containing magical creatures or events, most often read or told to children
- 11. A genre of fiction in which the plot takes place in the past
- 12. A narrative about a criminal act based on fact, rather than fiction
- 15, A genre that uses a story to convey a moral
- 18. A genre that is passed down through generations including traditional beliefs
- 19. The story of someone's life written by that person

- 1. A genre with larger than life or greatly exaggerated characters
- 2. A genre that focuses on humorous effect
- 4. Untrue literature including short stories and novels
- 5. A how-to book on a topic such as gardening or auto repair
- 9. The story of someone's life written by another person
- 10. A genre in which the plot could not happen in real life (as we know it). Often the plot involves magic or witchcraft
- 13. A traditional story usually concerning a hero or event
- 14. A genre of fiction that involves a death or a crime to be solved
- 16. A genre of fiction in which the plot and characters are used to elicit a terrifying sense of dread
- 17. A form of writing that has meter and rhythm
