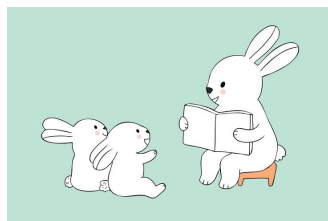
General Information

COVID Update. As the Covid situation improves, we are able to expand some of our services. **Hours are expanding** in April. Starting the week of **April 12**, Tuesday and Thursday hours extend to 7:00 PM and we reopen Saturdays from 10 am to 2 pm. We are able to accomplish this with the return of volunteers. We are adding some outdoors activities as well. As before, we offer limited computer use, printing, faxing, and copying. The quarantine period for returned items is now reduced from seven days to three days — but continue to return items in the exterior drop box. Masks and social distancing are still required for when at the library. As with many things during this time, these changes are themselves subject to change as the situation warrants.
