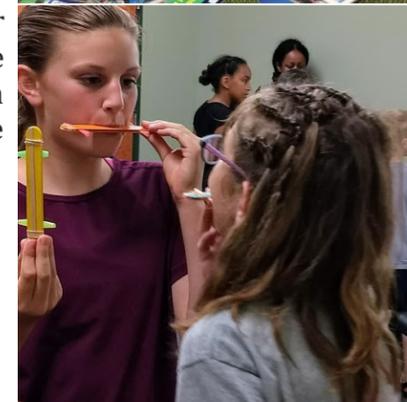

Beginner or experienced, bring your project and sit and chat. Refreshments provided. Program held on the second Monday of the month.

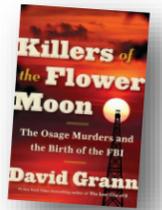


Monday, Feb. 18 at 12:30pm "Quick Tips" before Adult Yoga
