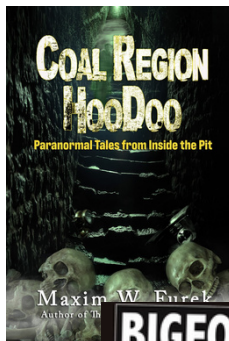

## An Afternoon with Paranormal Researchers Maxim W. Furek and Timothy Renner



Maxim Furek's new book, *Coal Region Hoodoo: Paranormal Tales Inside the Pit*, explores stories of high strangeness unique to the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. His previous book, *Sheppton: The Myth, Miracle, & Music*, documents apparitions and humanoids sighted during the bizarre 1963 Sheppton mining disaster.



Timothy Renner is the author of several books on the paranormal, including *Bigfoot in Pennsylvania*, and explores various aspects of the supernatural and forgotten history on his podcast, *Strange Familiars*. He is also an illustrator and musician recognized for his research on Bigfoot and other anomalies.
