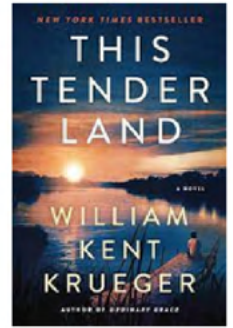

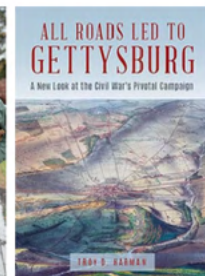
Esther shows off the play money that she won during a recent volunteer appreciation event.
