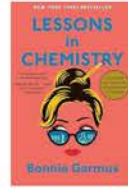


# Adult Programs

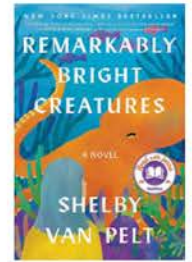
Monday, May 13th at 1pm **The Knitting and Crocheting Group** meets on the 2nd Monday of the month at 1pm.
