### Things You Should Know!

York County has reached the CDC (Centers for Disease Control) classification level for "High Risk" community transmission. Given the new variants and upward trend of positive COVID-19 cases, many businesses, municipal institutions, and non-profit organizations are taking steps to aid mitigation efforts against the spread of COVID. ## Meet Guthrie's New Library Director: Shanna Hollich



Hello! I'm Shanna Hollich, and I'm very excited to be serving the folks of the Hanover community as the new director for the Guthrie Memorial Library. I'm a long-time central Pennsylvania resident – I grew up in Lebanon County and then traveled a bit before returning to central PA, this time in Adams County (first in Biglerville and now in Gettysburg). I've had several ties to the Hanover area since returning to PA, most commonly through my side work as a classical musician. I've volunteered and performed in the past with local community groups such as The Lyric Band, the Hanover Symphony Orchestra, the recently closed PA Theatrical Arts dance studio, the Littlestown Area Municipal Band,

the Singer Band of Mechanicsburg, and several community theatre performances over the years at the Eichelberger and some of the local area high schools.

In my professional life, I've been a librarian for 12 years, after a brief career as a legal assistant and tax consultant. I have worked in all types of libraries. I began my career as a high school and then middle school librarian before transitioning to public library service. I then worked for a short time as a federal contractor at the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration's Central Library in Silver Spring, MD before my most recent role as the Collections Management Librarian and the Interim Director for the John Stewart Memorial Library at Wilson College in Chambersburg. When the pandemic hit, I had some time to reflect, and I realized that what I wanted most was to return to public service. I'll probably never stop being an educator – I'm a nationally recognized scholar in the area of copyright law and open education, and I am often asked to speak at conferences, present workshops, and provide trainings for library and educational professionals about these topics. But I'm eager to use that education experience in more direct service to the public. I'm a lifelong learner, and fostering that love of learning and growing is one of the things that libraries do best.

One thing I have seen time and again here is the love that the residents have for this community, and the pride that they have in their public library. I chose to come to Guthrie because the library here is already doing outstanding work. I'm blessed to have a truly excellent group of staff members who consistently go above and beyond to provide the best customer service they can. I'm hoping to continue to facilitate that good work as we take public library services forward into the 21<sup>st</sup> century, while continuing to hang on to the traditions and values that have served us so well in the past.

I would like to take the time to thank the many folks who have ably steered the ship over the last few months and years, especially: Interim Director Julie Moul, Borough Manager Nan Dunford, the Hanover Borough Council, the Guthrie Memorial Library Board of Governors, the Hanover Public Library Association, the Friends of the Library, and our wonderful staff and group of volunteers. In addition to the fundraisers they plan throughout the year, such as the annual book sale and jewelry sale, the Friends also have an ongoing book sale on the Adult floor of the Library.
