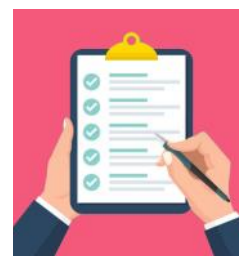

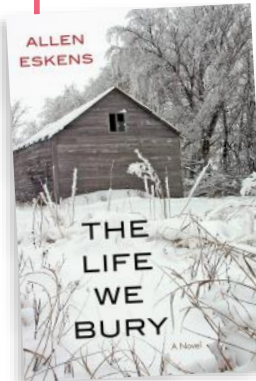

About the Book: *The Life We Bury*, tells the story of Joe Talbert who avoided doing his college English assignment until it was almost too late. Interviewing an old person about his life didn't sound all that interesting. Who cared? He had enough trouble dealing with his own life. But when Joe decides to interview a Vietnam vet convicted of a murder 30 years ago, he thinks maybe it won't be so boring after all.

About the Author: Allen Eskens is an award winning, bestselling author whose books have been translated into 26 languages.

About One Book, One Community: This year's OBOC campaign represents collaboration between 40 libraries in four counties — including York County Libraries! Everyone is welcome to read and discuss the book. A reading group guide and related materials will be available online later this month.
