- The last 4 digits of your library card number are your pin?
- You can access your library account online? From any device with internet access, go to yorklibraries.org/hanover-guthrie. In the upper right corner, click on My Account. Log in by entering your entire library barcode number and your pin number (the last 4 digits of the barcode repeated). While in your account, you can renew your checked-out items and even place materials on hold!

Winning with Robots! by Annabelle Allport

Guthrie Geeks Community Robotics Team

This was a great year for the Guthrie Geeks Community Robotics team. We accomplished a lot this season, and the team, ages 12 to 18, has already started planning and training for the next season. In addition to performing very well in their qualifying events, the team won a prestigious award.

This is the "Geeks" fourth year participating in the FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC). Each year, students are given a technical challenge inspired by those society currently faces. Teams have 3 months to design and build their robots. Then, teams

compete at regional qualifiers for the opportunity to move on to the state competition. At each qualifier, teams compete in five qualifying matches with other teams from all around Pennsylvania. Four randomly selected teams compete in each match. These four teams are paired off into alliances: a team that you compete against in one match might be a partner in a future match. Each match begins with a 30 second autonomous period where the robot must perform actions with no user input. After that, the match changes into a remote-control mode where the team drives the robot around to score additional points.

This year, at their first qualifying event held at Penn State York, the Geeks placed 4th (out of 30 competitors) with their robot, Big Bad Jeremiah. Building on that success, the team made a couple of small improvements to the robot and then competed again at the Red Tornado qualifier in Lancaster. They performed even better, placing 2nd out of 26 teams! At both events, the team earned the opportunity to compete in the semifinal rounds but fell short of moving on to the state competition.

In addition to the engineering aspects of the competition, FTC has several other ways to compete. Each team must give a 5-minute presentation to a panel of judges where they summarize the team's activities throughout their season. This year, the team won the coveted Connect Award for our community outreach, hosting two FTC events at Guthrie Memorial Library, and teaching a robotics merit badge workshop. The team won 3rd place for the Control Award that recognizes the use of programming to improve robot control.

Later this year, the Geeks plan to host their first Antweight Robot Combat Event at the library in the late summer or early fall 2023. These events will be open to the public and we'd love to see you there!

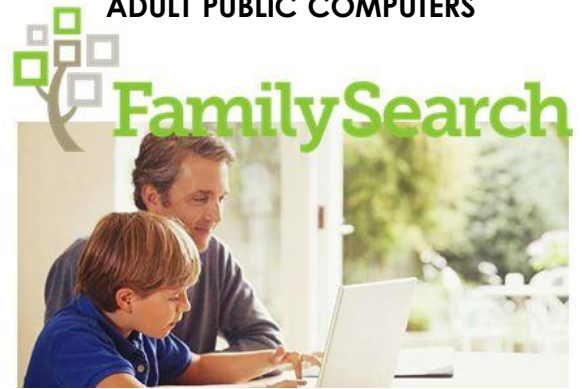

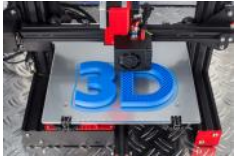
