## LEARN WHAT MAMMAL SKULLS

### DO

Our March, 3rd Wednesday Series of Community programs will be especially exciting and interesting for children. Parents and grandparents, please bring them along. Dr. Roger Wilson will present a program using his collection of more than 100 mammal skulls.

Dr. Wilson began his career as an educator in the South Eastern School District in 1968.

Wilson taught 4th and 6th grades for 20 years. He relates that he wasn't particularly interested in bones until the day one of his 4th graders brought an owl pellet to school. They dissected the pellet and found the tiny skull of a vole, a rodent owls eat, complete and unbroken. This event triggered an interest in the skulls of many animals.

Eventually an opportunity to be a full-time science teacher allowed him to share this new passion with his students who were eager to see and handle actual skulls as part of their lessons. While teaching at South Eastern,

Dr. Wilson pursued a doctoral degree in Science Education at the University of Maryland. He later became a Professor at Millersville University preparing many future teachers to teach science.
