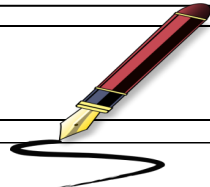

The first art exhibition of the 2024 season will open with a reception.

The exhibit will feature the work of local artists Glenn Grove and Frank Wright.

**Glenn Grove** is a Stewartstown native who has lived in Delta for more than 40 years. His professional career of 38 years as art teacher and art department chairman included recognition as Hartford County Art Teacher of the Year in 1982. Glenn obtained his bachelor's and master's degree in fine arts from Maryland Institute College of Art in Baltimore, and in 1973 he was a Fulbright scholar and studied in Belgium and The Netherlands.

Red Lion resident **Frank Wright** has also been painting most of his life. Frank started painting at York College in 1975 and dabbled in it during his 33-year work career. He is self-taught with just one college course and Bob Ross videos. Frank's paintings were exhibited at the Glen Rock library last year and can be found at Framers Workshop in York.
