
### 7 Stages of Block Play

- 1. Carrying blocks
- 2. Stacking both vertical and horizontal
- 3. Bridging
- 4. Enclosures
- 5. Patterns and Symetry
- 6. Early Representational
- 7. Later Representational

Children move through these stages in this order. But once each stage is mastered, they will move

backward and forward through them.
