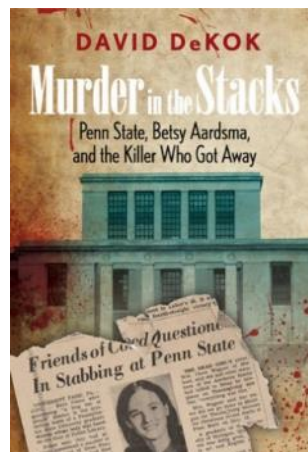

The Cold Case of the Murder at the Penn State Library

On November 28, 1969 Betsy Aardsma was murdered in the Penn State University Library. The killer was never caught, but through research and interviews David Dekok has collected enough evidence to identify the probable killer. Join us on November 8th at 6 p.m. to hear the tragic story of a young life cut short, the investigation into her death, and David's theories regarding the identity of the killer.

Adult History Class: The Holocaust

Prelude to the Holocaust: WWI-1933

Monday, Nov. 7 & 14 • 6-8 pm • BARE CTR (BASEMENT LEVEL)

Prelude to the Holocaust: WWI-1933, will start with a brief look at WWI, including the Treaty of Versailles and the effect on Germany. World War I (1914–1918) devastated Europe and created new countries. The years that followed saw the continent struggle to recover from the death or injury of tens of millions of soldiers and civilians, as well as catastrophic damage to property and industry. Between WWI and 1933 was the Weimar Republic, a fragile democracy. During this time, students will analyze the importance of Act 48, hyperinflation, and the Free Corps. It is during this time that Adolph Hitler begins his rise to power. Continuing, we look at pre-WWII Jewish life and how it began to change.

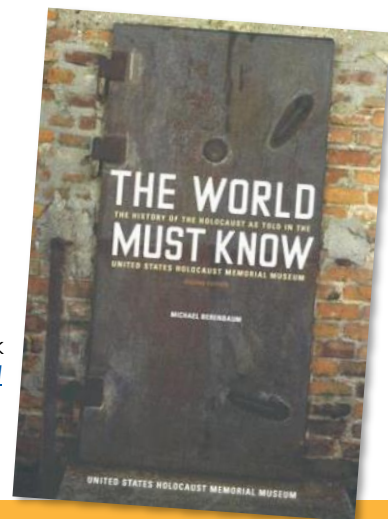
The Holocaust: 1933-1938

The Holocaust: 1933-1938, will begin in 1933, when the Nazi regime established the first concentration camps, imprisoning its political opponents, homosexuals, Jehovah's Witnesses, and others classified as "dangerous." Extensive propaganda was used to spread the Nazi Party's racist goals and ideals. During the first six years of Hitler's dictatorship, German Jews felt the effects of more than 400 decrees and regulations that restricted all aspects of their public and private lives.

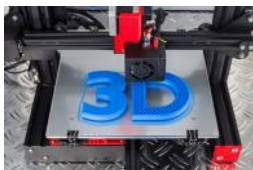

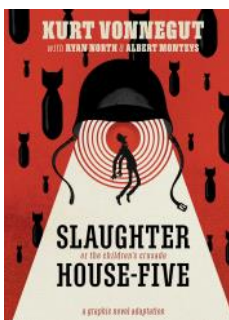

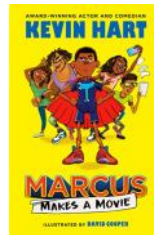
