
LAWYER REFERRAL SERVICE

The York County Bar Association's Lawyer Referral Service can help you find the right attorney at the right time.





- 1. Upon contacting Attorney Connection at (717) 854-8755, our representative will refer you to an attorney experienced in the field of law that meets your specific needs and provide you with contact information so you can set up your 30-minute consultation.
- 2. You will be asked to give your name, contact information, and a brief description of your legal matter to the representative.
- 3. At the time of the referral, you will pay a \$50 fee payable by cash, money order or credit card that guarantees you a 30-minute consultation with the attorney. Following the consultation, if you decide to hire the attorney for further representation, additional attorney fees and/or costs will apply.

MODEST MEANS PROGRAM

The York County Bar Association's Modest Means program may help moderate to low-income York County residents find affordable legal assistance in the areas of family law, criminal defense and tenant/evictions (through the hearing at the MDJ).



Upon contacting the Modest Means Program at (717) 854-8755 x204, you will be provided a Modest Means application. Everyone must complete the application and submit verification of income/dependents to see if they qualify.

If you qualify, you will be contacted to pay a \$25 referral fee payable by cash, money order or credit card that guarantees you a 30-minute consultation with the attorney. Following the consultation, if you decide to hire the attorney for further representation, the attorney agrees to charge the Modest Means rate of \$100 hour or 60% of their typical retainer.

All Lawyer Referral Service attorneys are licensed and appropriately insured and must meet stringent program guidelines.

Pardon Projects pair pardon applicants with volunteers who help guide them through the application process. The Pardon Project of York County seeks to assist individuals with a Pennsylvania criminal record, who have completely served their sentence (including probation and parole) and are seeking a pardon of their crime(s).
