


## PAUL SMITH LIBRARY HONORS

# Honoring Jim & Jean Holley



Jim and Jean Holley have been valuable members of the Southern York County community throughout their lives. Mr. Holley, a United States Marine and Vietnam veteran, and Mrs. Holley, a former schoolteacher, purchased their first home together in New Freedom in 1967, and served their community in a variety of ways as members of the

Jaycees and Jaycettes. In 1968, Jean represented the New Freedom Women's Club on a commission tasked with the creation of a local library. Jim served on the fundraising committee to finance the construction of the Southern York County Library, now known as the Paul Smith Library of Southern York County. Mr. Holley was instrumental in procuring the site for the library, through a long-term lease with the YMCA. Throughout the Holley's involvement with the library, Jean volunteered at the circulation desk, presented story times, managed public relations, and served as assistant librarian. True to their Southern York County roots, Jim and Jean met in 1961 at the Shrewsbury Carnival. They were married in 1965 and have two children, Laura and Linda.

The Holleys demonstrate passion for the Southern York County community, commitment to literacy, and dedication to the library. Jim and Jean have truly made our community a better place to live and learn.
