Honoring **C. Kim Bracey**

C. Kim Bracey is a native of York and currently serves as the Executive Director for the Governor's Center for Local Government Services with the Pennsylvania Department of Community & Economic Development. She oversees the Center's ability to provide a full range of vital programs, training, and services to resolve problems at the local level.

Kim was appointed as the City of York's Community Development Director in June 2003 overseeing one of the City's most diverse departments. On November 3, 2009, she was elected the first African-American mayor of the City of York and was sworn in as the 24th mayor on January 4, 2010. Kim served two 4-year terms as mayor. As York City's chief executive officer, she was responsible for all aspects of the general management of the city, including the city's \$98-million dollar budget, and the enforcement of all laws and ordinances serving a population of 44,000 residents.

As mayor, she fostered millions of dollars in redevelopment through public-private partnerships and secured numerous federal and state revitalization grants. Advocating for the City of York, she provided state and federal testimony on subjects ranging from fiscal modernization of local government to economic and community development and education reform.

Kim's civic spirit extends far beyond the walls of local and state government, which is proven by her steadfast support of many organizations. She served on the boards of York Hospital, Martin Library, York County Community Foundation, York County Economic Alliance, 10,000 Friends of PA, Pennsylvania Downtown Center, American Red Cross, and Habitat for Humanity. Kim is the founding President of the York Chapter of the National Coalition of 100 Black Women and an active member of her church. She is a Trustee of York College of Pennsylvania and a Soror of the Sigma Gamma Rho Sorority, National.
