

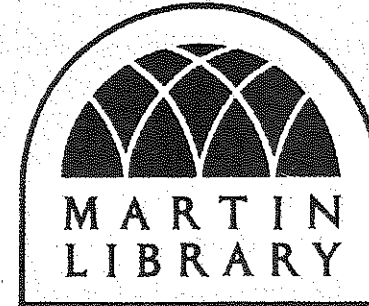

## **Helen K. Klinedinst**

*For nearly 15 years, Helen Klinedinst was a comforting presence for thousands of York school children who ventured into the John E. Baker Children's Library. Her gentle and helpful manner made book-lovers out of children who were scared and overwhelmed by the enormity of the ceilings and the shelves.*

*Mrs. Klinedinst, who had been an elementary school librarian, joined the Martin Library staff in 1967. After a brief stint as children's librarian, she returned to York City schools as a seventh-grade English teacher at Edgar Fahs Smith Junior High School. She continued to work evenings and Saturday's in Martin's children's room until 1981.*

*Mrs. Klinedinst, who died Nov. 7, 1996, was the wife of Paul E. Klinedinst Sr., a William Penn Senior High mathematics teacher who died in 1966. For more than 50 years she and her family resided at 451 W. King St. in York.*

*Helen Myers Keller Klinedinst was born July 14, 1910, on a farm in Lower Windsor Township, York County.*

*Mrs. Klinedinst was a 1926 graduate of York High School and a 1929 graduate of Millersville Normal School. She taught English and geography at Hannah Penn Junior High School for two and a half years until marrying on December 29, 1931.*

*Mrs. Klinedinst was a frequent speaker at church and community groups, speaking on family-related topics or delivering oral book reviews.*

*After her husband retired from teaching in 1961 because of a disability, Mrs. Klinedinst returned to teaching by becoming school librarian at Hartley School.*

*Her six surviving sons and three daughters are: Paul E. Klinedinst Jr., of Northridge, Calif.; Barbara M. Schmitthenner, of Gettysburg; Henry D. Klinedinst, of Dover; Allan V. Klinedinst, of York; Jeanette M. Bentzel, of Camp Hill; Ruth N. Althouse, of York; Maurice C. Klinedinst, of York; John S. Klinedinst, of York, and Philip M. Klinedinst, of York. A son, Richard G. Klinedinst, died in 1952. Other family members include 20 grandchildren and 13 great-grandchildren.*
